Remote Learning Plan

The aim of the Remote Learning Plan is to ensure learning is continued, irrespective of lockdown and self-isolation. This plan shows how remote learning will be offered to all pupils and acknowledges that some households have limited access or no access to the internet and devices. Remote learning includes both access to on-line resources as well as paper-based learning.

As detailed below, pupil use of some online resources such as Purple Mash can be monitored by class teachers. Other websites have been recommended to pupils and their families, such as 'The Oak Academy' however, the use of such websites cannot be monitored by school.

This plan complies with the expectations and principle outlined in the DFE document 'Guidance for Full Opening of Schools'.
